Driving Factors and Growth



- Prior Authorizations are labor and cost intensive
- Prior Authorizations continue to increase in volume
- The risk of prescription and benefit abandonment is critically high
- ePA legislation is being implemented on a state-by-state level
- Specialty drug trends

Reasons for Prior Authorization



Quantity Limit – The plan may limit the number (or amount) of drugs covered within a certain time period.

Step Therapy – The plan requires the patient to begin medication with the most cost-effective and safest drug therapy, and progress to other more costly or risky therapies only if necessary.

Non-Formulary – Most formularies cover at least one drug in each drug class, all other drugs in the same class would be considered off the plan's formulary, or Non-Formulary.

PA Required – The plan will need to review a medication before it will be covered. This can apply to both brands and generics.

The Electronic Prior Authorization Solution

Electronic prior authorization (ePA) connects all participants to provide real-time information for the PA decision-making process.



PROSPECTIVE: Started by the prescriber during the E-Prescribing process. Allows for real-time auto-determination from the payer, acts as decision support for electronic prescribing.

The industry has progressed to make in implementing a prospective ePA solution and making it accessible to prescribers.



RETROSPECTIVE: Begins following a claim rejection at the pharmacy. Best practice is to initiate the ePA through connectivity in the pharmacy management system.

The result of ePA is a more efficient healthcare process, and ultimately healthier patients that are getting the medications they need to live healthier lives.

By the Numbers: PA Hours



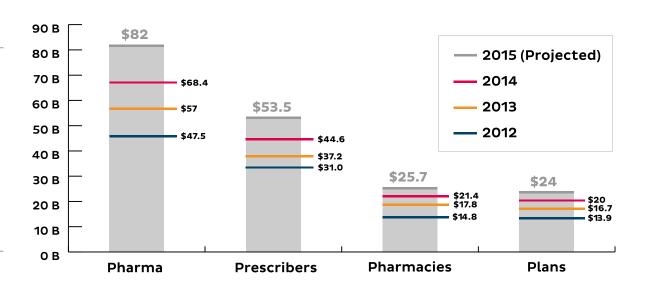
More than half of prescribers indicate that they and their staff spend up to 20 hours per week on PAs

The current prior authorization system is a substantial burden to all involved. An estimate from the Center for Health Transformation 2012 study



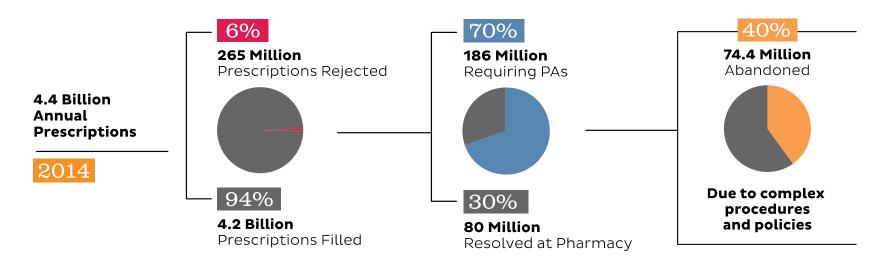
Annual \$ Impact of PAs

Volume and Abandonment

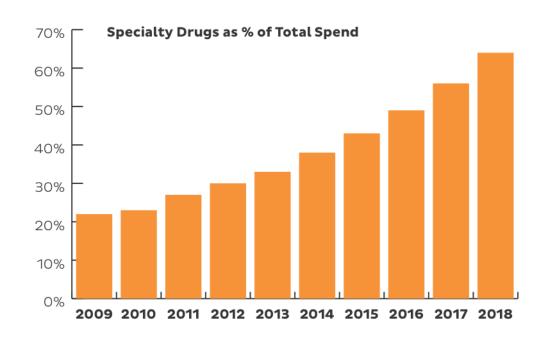
Recent studies reflect **265 million claims a year result in prior authorizations.**

90% of health plans use prior authorizations to control the cost of specialty drugs





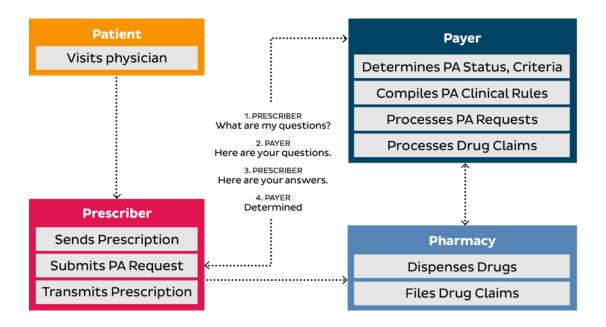

ePA Process

The ePA process involves a 4-part transaction that enables patient-specific and drug-specific PA criteria and a real-time approval process.

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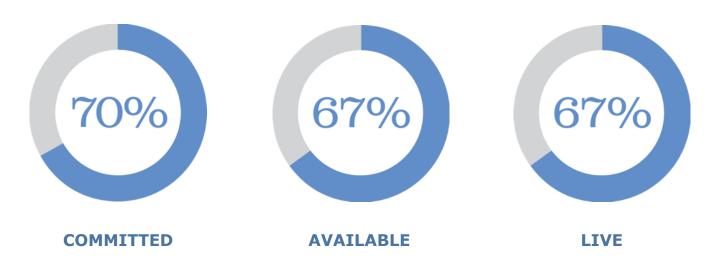
