Rule & Change

HEA 1263

- Effective July 1, 2016
- Allows for prescribing via telemedicine visit; removing 1950's language requiring face-to-face consult first
- Becomes the 47th state to successfully implement prescribing via a telemedicine visit

- "will permit providers, with prescriptive authority, to prescribe certain prescriptions, drugs and devices during remote patient visits"



Definitions

- Remote Patient Visit
 - the use of secure videoconferencing;
 - interactive audio-using store and forward technology;
 - remote patient monitoring technology between a provider in one location and a patient in another location.
- Provider defined as physicians, optometrists, advance practice nurses and physician assistants



Definitions

- *Prescription limits* Providers are not permitted to prescribe:
 - controlled substances
 - abortion inducing drugs
 - ophthalmic devices, including glasses, contact lenses and low vision devices



Key provisions

- 8 key items outlined
 - must establish a proper physician-patient relationship
 - Standards of care
 - must obtain informed consent from the patient
 - "Store and forward technology"
 - Creating and maintaining a medical record, sharing with primary care physician upon patient consent
