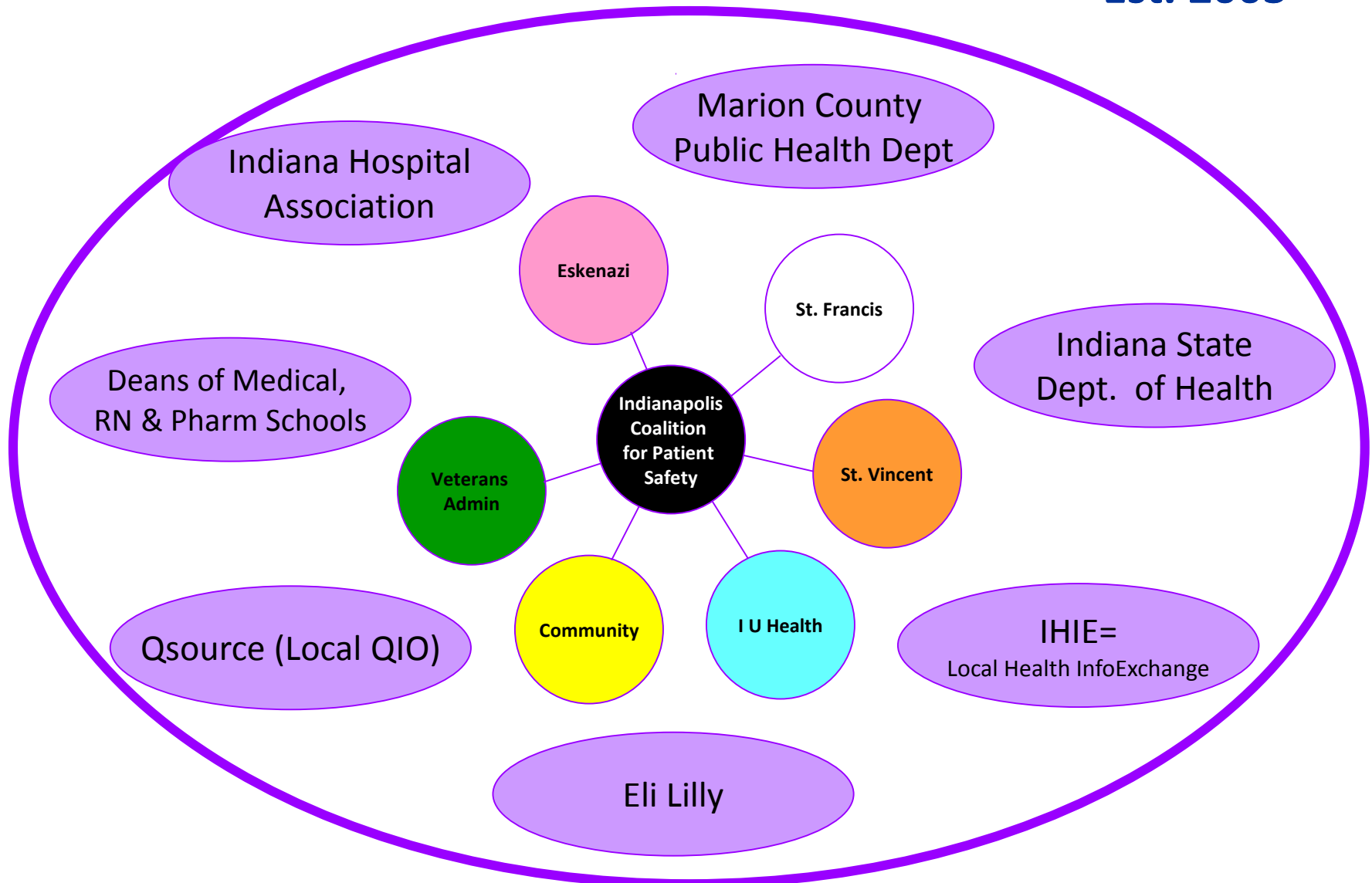

Background: *Being Mortal* Documentary Project

- John and Wauna Harman Foundation funded FRONTLINE *Being Mortal* documentary, which first aired in 2015.
- Hospice Foundation of America (HFA) awarded grants to take program to more than 200 Screening Sites/viewing locations throughout U.S. through community distribution.
- HFA's goal is to exceed the 200 screening site locations within the scope of the grant, to support Screening Partners with materials, resources and advice, and to collect data that will demonstrate a growth in awareness and action by people who participate in this project.

Background: Being Mortal Documentary Project

Goals of the project

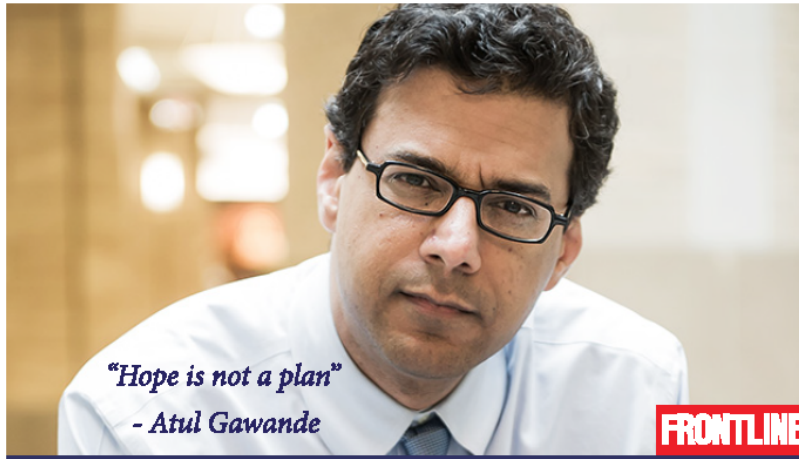
1. Engage communities in a dialogue about advance care planning and share with loved ones and physicians what matters most to them at the end of life.
2. Raise awareness by helping people understand that being proactive about end-of-life conversations and planning will impact the way they die and affect their and their families' futures.
3. Provide knowledge and materials to encourage attendees take the next steps in developing their end-of-life care wishes, including discussing those wishes with their loved ones and clinicians.
4. Engage clinicians in joining the community conversation about understanding what matters most at life's end.

- “Experts” in advance care planning & end-of-life care should be available to answer questions that may arise
- Clinical participation in the dialogue is encouraged to help clinicians be more open to these conversations

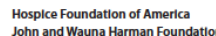
