





Figure 4.1. All-State Trends in Relative Prices




Figure 4.3. Trends in Relative Prices for Selected States, 2015–2017






Figure 4.2. Relative Prices, by State, 2017




Indiana: INPATIENT Prices Relative to Medicare 2017





Indiana: OUTPATIENT Prices Relative to Medicare 2017





Indiana: TOTAL Prices Relative to Medicare 2017





VALUE FOR EMPLOYERS

Value = Quality
Cost

where Cost = Price x Quantity

Example - Bolts

Bolt Quality: steal or plastic, strength, etc.

Total Cost: $$1 \times 5 \text{ bolts} = 5

Total Cost: $$5 \times 1 \text{ bolt} = 5



VALUE FOR EMPLOYERS

Value = Quality
PRICE x Quantity
