We both are trying to earn a living here. We're both trying to be productive citizens and all that, and we need help!"








## NATIONAL CONCERN: DO WE HAVE ENOUGH CARE RESOURCES FOR OUR AGING POPULATION?

- Family Caregiver Pool:
  - 2015: 7 possible caregivers for each person over the age of 85
  - 2050: when all baby boomers will be ages 85+ it will be 3 possible caregivers to each person over the age of 85
  - Providing an economic value of \$470 billion in unpaid contributions

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


# LONG TERM SERVICE AND SUPPORTS PAYMENT CHALLENGES

## WHO PAYS FOR PAID LTSS

- Most LTSS costs are paid by Medicaid and individuals paying out of pocket.
- Medicare does not cover extensive LTSS.

#### WHAT DOES THIS ALL LOOK LIKE IN INDIANA?


- Single mother moving her 3 children from Lafayette to Indianapolis in hopes of receiving any care at all for her 1-year old baby who qualifies for 18 hours of home nursing care every day and hasn't received an hour
- "If we can't work, how are we supposed to survive? Not only can I not work, I cannot support my other kids, my household, my bills," Wright said, holding back tears.





### WHAT DOES THIS ALL LOOK LIKE IN INDIANA?

- Mother of 4, all with special medical needs, sleeping on the floor to be nearby in case any of her children need her
- "Yeah, we're lucky," said Natasha Bolings. "There's a lot of families that don't have it at all." Talking about receiving only half of their 207 hours of pre-authorized nursing care approved weekly by the state Medicaid program
