WHO WE ARE

The Employers' Forum of Indiana is an employer-led health care coalition, founded in 2001, comprised of employers, physicians, hospitals, health plans, benefit consultants, and other interested parties. The Forum is committed to providing quality, price, and cost transparency across the healthcare ecosystem; collaborating with healthcare stakeholders to align payment with high value medical and pharmacy services; and supporting public health initiatives. We accomplish this by providing educations, conducting research, and engaging in policy. We believe that by empowering employers and people with evidence-based data, it permits them to make more informed decisions. The Employers' Forum of Indiana is a non-profit 501(c)(3) public charity.

PREMISE

Employers who work collaboratively with a unified voice can more effectively partner with providers, health plans, and other partners to address pressing healthcare issues.

- The Forum provides collaborative opportunities as the largest employer-led multi-stakeholder coalition in Indiana.
- The intention of the Forum is to foster healthcare value improvement that is substantial and continuous.

GOAL

To improve the value received by employers and patients for their healthcare expenditures. Value considerations include price, quality, employee satisfaction and utilization.

- Provide guidance on the future direction of Forum education topics and initiatives

- The Forum hosts quarterly all-stakeholder meetings at which local and national speakers present/lead discussions on a variety of healthcare topics. - A monthly newsletter for members and interested stakeholders is available.
- The Forum also hosts employer-only meetings and task groups to discuss various initiatives.
- A key initiative of the Forum is commissioning RAND Corp to conduct the first national hospital price transparency study in the country to publicly report relative prices at the hospital level. The first study in this series, RAND 1.0, which analyzes 120 hospitals in Indiana, published in 2017; RAND 2.0 which analyzes 1600 hospitals in 25 states, of which Indiana was the highest priced state, published in 2019; RAND 3.0, which includes 49 states plus D.C., published in 2020; RAND 4.0, which includes 49 states plus D.C., published in 2022;



and RADN 5.1, which includes 49 states plus D.C., published in 2024. These landmark studies can be found on the Forum's Price Transparency Project website: <u>www.employerPTP.org</u>

- A second key initiative of the Forum is the creation of Sage Transparency 2.0. Sage Transparency 2.0 is a free, public-facing tool designed to offer a clear, unbiased view of hospital price, cost, and quality data, as well as price data for ambulatory surgery centers (ASCs) and physician-administered medications with a goal to aid employers, policymakers, researchers, and the general public in making informed, evidence-based healthcare decisions. LEADSERHIP

David Kelleher: President and CEO of the Employers' Forum of Indiana

Mr. Kelleher was the founding CEO of the Employers' Forum in Indiana. He holds a Master of Science degree in Economics and has managed health care organizations since completing his military service in 1972. He was one of the founders of the first prepaid group practice in Indiana and served as its Executive Vice President from 1973 to 1986. He then founded HealthCare Options (HOI) and is its president. Since 1986 HOI has developed and managed health care organizations and provided consulting services to health plans, medical groups, hospitals, academic medical centers, and employers in 38 states.

HealthCare Options managed the Employers Forum from 2001 until 2015 and was one of the organizers of Quality Health First of Indiana. Quality Health First was a statewide, multi-payer, quality reporting and pay-for-performance program developed and managed by the Indiana Health Information Exchange. Mr. Kelleher was also the program manager of the Central Indiana Beacon Collaborative.
