#### Indiana legislative leaders take aim at 'out-of-control' health care prices (IBJ)

House Speaker Todd Huston and Senate President Rod Bray sent a joint letter in January to 20 **hospital** and **insurance** executives, telling them to submit a plan by April 1 that would lower Indiana's hospital prices to the national average or lower by 2025. 
