Biographies

Guy D'Andrea, MBA

Guy D'Andrea is the Executive Director of the Catalyst for Payment Reform. He brings 30 years of health policy and strategic consulting to CPR, with a special focus on performance measures and innovative payment models. As Executive Director, Guy works with the CPR staff and Board of Directors to implement ideas and develop resources that will drive greater value in health care.

Guy founded Discern Health in 2004, growing it from a single-person consultancy to a team of over 30 talented staff. Discern's clients included trade groups and associations, health plans, government, and life sciences companies. Projects undertaken by Discern included the design and development of hospital and physician pay-for-performance programs, decision tools for health care purchasers, and payment structures and quality measures for patient-centered medical homes and accountable care organizations.

More recently, Guy worked as an entrepreneur-in-residence for Healthworx, the investment and innovation arm of CareFirst health plan. Earlier in his career, Guy was Vice President at URAC, where he was responsible for the development of URAC's accreditation programs and its government affairs activities. Guy earned his undergraduate degree from Cornell University and dual Master of Business Administration degrees from Columbia University and the London Business School. He also completed a business innovation program at Oxford University.

Jonathan Handsborough, MBA

Jonathan Handsborough is the Executive Director of the Indiana All-Payer Claims Data System at the Indiana Department of Insurance. The purpose of the Indiana Department of Insurance is to protect Hoosiers as they purchase and use insurance products to keep their assets and families free from loss or harm. Consumers may need assistance with certain claim situations or just help with understanding how their policies work. The Department's primary obligation is to monitor the financial solvency of the insurance companies domiciled in Indiana so that the legal promises made in insurance policies are honored.

Prior to his current role, Jonathan served as a Director/Database Administrator with the Department. Before joining the Department, Jonathan co-owned an Insurance Firm for ten years and worked as a Hospital Administrator in Austin Texas. Jonathan obtained his Master's in Business Administration (MBA) from Regis University in Denver, Colorado, and is a member of the following organizations: National Black MBA Association, the Chief Financial Officer Network, and the Healthcare Executives Network.

Morgan McDonald, MD FACP FAAP

Dr. McDonald leads the Milbank Memorial Fund's state health policy programming and leadership development, bringing together state and local executive and legislative branch leaders and connecting them with nonpartisan, evidence-based resources and experience. Dr. McDonald served for eight years in executive administration at the Tennessee Department of Health, most recently as the Interim Health Commissioner and previously as Deputy Commissioner for Population Health and Assistant Commissioner for Family Health and



Wellness. In these roles, she provided senior leadership for the state's pandemic response and recovery efforts, championed the Department's rural health and health equity implementation work, and successfully led the state's maternal and child health improvement initiatives. Dr. McDonald began her career as a primary care physician and advocate for people experiencing homelessness and has held educational leadership positions at the University of North Carolina and then Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. She led curricula in inter-professional education, protective community factors, and the care of marginalized populations for medical school and residency programs. Board certified in internal medicine and pediatrics, Dr. McDonald has continued to see patients in Nashville's immigrant community to maintain the roots of policy making in patient journeys.

Ashley Rainey MSN, RNC-OB, IAP

Ashley Rainey achieved her Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) degree in 2011 and embarked on a labor and delivery nursing career in Indiana. Over time, she developed a deep passion for perinatal care, leading her to her current role as the Maternal and Child Health Clinical Director for the State of Indiana. In this capacity, she plays a vital role in promoting the clinical practice of the 75 delivering facilities in the state. Ashley is a distinguished Sigma Theta Tau International Nursing Honor Society member and an alumna of the 2019 Maternal-Child Nursing Leadership Academy cohort. She remains actively engaged with the Association of Women's Health, Obstetric, and Neonatal Nurses (AWHONN) at national and local levels. She is pursuing her Ph.D. in Nursing Research at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Cameual Wright, MD, MBA

Dr. Cameual Wright serves as the Market President for CareSource Indiana, where she spearheads initiatives to deliver high-quality, equitable health care to underserved populations across the state. Her leadership is centered on improving health outcomes for all Hoosiers, focusing on reducing health disparities and ensuring those with complex needs have access to the comprehensive care they deserve.

Prior to her current role, Dr. Wright was Chief Medical Officer for CareSource Indiana. She was instrumental in shaping medical and pharmacy policies and spearheading clinical initiatives to expand access to care for underserved communities. Her leadership fostered collaborations with providers and community organizations to drive health equity throughout the state.

Bringing more than 15 years of expertise in obstetrics and gynecology, Dr. Wright has held key leadership positions, including Chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and President of Medical Staff in Indiana. Her passion for maternal and infant health drives her continued efforts to close gaps in care for vulnerable families.

In addition to her leadership at CareSource, Dr. Wright serves on several boards, including the Indiana Health Information Exchange (IHIE), the Indiana Rural Health Association, the American Red Cross, and the Indiana Perinatal Quality Improvement Collaborative. She is deeply involved in initiatives aimed at improving health outcomes, particularly in maternal and infant care, and continues to play an active role in advancing health equity across Indiana. Dr. Wright received her undergraduate and medical degrees from the University of Michigan and earned her Master of Business Administration from Indiana University.
