The Indiana 2021 session was a budget year and began on January 4 th and adjourned on April 29, 2021. In total, 1,011 bills were introduced including 220 bills which succeeded in the legislative process for a 22K total passing rate. The 2021 Legislative Session was a budget year. A summary of the FY 22/23 budget can be found here. 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


Forum Project on Federal Price Transparency Rule: Assessment of Indiana Hospitals

- September 17, 2021
- Aim: to improve the consumer price transparency experience by partnering with hospitals to improve their hospital price transparency efforts.
- **N = 118** Indiana hospitals
- Report Findings:

- 20.3% of hospitals scored 8 points (the best score)
- 55.9% of hospitals scored 7 points
- 14.4% of hospitals scored 6 points
- 9.3% of hospitals scored 5 points or less (4 hospitals scored 1 point, the worst score)
